*Kim Williams- The city owns the roads. Questioned if the construction company will come back to fix the roads after completion.-*Roger replied, "City will need to fix certain areas, but council may ask construction company to repair the roads as a stipulation. A bond will need to done so work completion is determined and bond released at that time."

*Faye Durham-Questioned if builder agreed to conditions-*Roger replied, "New conditions/concerns can be discussed with builders. The meeting with zoning committee and builders where there were issues brought to them during that time were addressed."
